2nd Quarter: April - June 2023

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The second quarter of 2023 saw notable progress in PPHI Sindh's healthcare efforts, as outlined in their newsletter. They celebrated the first successful Cesarean Section performed at the RHC Bhan Saeedabad, Jamshoro, along with the expansion of healthcare services in Sehwan, where 22 new healthcare facilities became operational. The statistics for April to June 2023 are as follows:

- **OPD Visits and New Cases:** A total of 8.69 Million OPD visits were recorded during the quarter, with 5.6 Million new cases and 2.98 Million follow-up cases.
- **Deliveries and Maternal Health:** The program managed 78,880 deliveries, including 2,272 Cesarean sections (CS). There were 175,622 ANC-1 visits and 451,030 ANC-1 revisit cases.
- **Family Planning Services:** FP visits reached 254,344, while the consumption of short-acting commodities included 69,303 OCPS and 18,404 IUCDs. Additionally, there were 105,510 injectables administered.
- **Hepatitis Screening and Vaccination:** Hepatitis-C and B screening showed progress with a total of 567,746 and 568,855 tests respectively. The hepatitis-B vaccine was administered with 38,154 doses in this period.
- **Nutrition Services:** The Accelerated Action Plan (AAP) continued to combat child malnutrition with 898 OTP sites across 21 districts. A total of 59,649 children were admitted for treatment, with successful recovery, transfers, and exits recorded.
- **Nutrition Stabilization Centers (NSCs):** NSCs handled severe malnutrition cases complicated by medical issues, and 2,665 children were admitted during the quarter, with successful recoveries, medical transfers, and exits.
- **Health Education Sessions:** Comprehensive health education sessions reached over 323,126 participants, addressing topics such as infant and young child feeding (IYCF), antenatal and postnatal care (ANC/PNC), tetanus vaccination (TT), and other health topics.

- **Commodity Consumption:** There was effective consumption of commodities like Ready-to-Use Therapeutic Food (RUTF), F-75, F-100, and essential medicines.
- **Health Facility Tele-Monitoring:** A total of 362 calls were made to monitor health facilities, with 307 facilities monitored across different regions.
- **EPI and UC Categories:** Immunization efforts were outlined by district and UC categories (Urban Centers), showcasing progress in vaccination coverage.

This comprehensive summary highlights the significant accomplishments, initiatives, and healthcare services provided by PPHI Sindh during the second quarter of 2023. The organization's efforts encompassed a wide range of healthcare services, from maternal health and family planning to nutrition stabilization and education sessions.

ACCELERATED ACTION PLAN - AAP

Accelerated Action plan is implemented by PPHI Sindh in twenty-one districts with support of Government of Sindh. The Nutrition services for severely children under five years of age are rendered through a network of 898 Outpatient Therapeutic Programme (OTP) sites in twenty-one districts of Sindh, whereas, severely malnourished children without any concomitant medical complication are managed. Whereas, the severely malnourished children with any of the life threatening medical complication are transferred to Nutrition stabilization centers (NSCs) for the management of their associated medical illness. There are fifteen NSC wards established in twelve districts of Sindh.



Out-patient Therapeutic Programme-OTP

Out-patient Therapeutic Programme is a nutrition management services station, established at health facilities, where the children under five years of age are assessed for nutritional status, followed by registration of the identified severely malnourished children without complications with provision of ready to use therapeutic food and medicines. The performance of all OTP sites, for the reporting period, is summarized in the following table;

Nutrition Stabilization Center-NSC

There are fifteen, well equipped, Nutrition Stabilization Centres established in DHQs, THQs and tertiary care hospitals of twelve districts of AAP). In NSCs, acutely malnourished children, who are suffering from the medical complications like severe diarrhoea, pneumonia, typhoid, meningitis and other fatal diseases, are medically and nutritionally managed. The complication specific treatment and nutrition management is provided as per WHO standards with F-75 & F-100 therapeutic milk, medicines and RUTF. The average length of stay of a child in the NSCs is around 06 days. The enrolled children are either referred from the OTP sites, from community by the outreach partners, or from the OPDs of the respective hospitals where NSCs are established. After the management of medical complications, the children are discharged from the NSC and referred to their nearest OTP site for outdoor nutrition management.

The NSCs are managed through integrated approach, where the space for the ward is provided by the hospital administration, the commodities i.e. therapeutic milk powder (F-75 & F-100), RUTF, NSC kit, staff training and reporting tools are provided by AAP Health department. The development of infrastructure, furniture, human resource, protocols of management and monitoring is the responsibility of PPHI Sindh. The performance of NSCs for the reporting period is tabulated below;

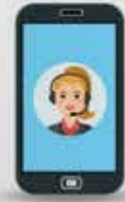

Solarization of all remaining 602 HF's under Phase-V

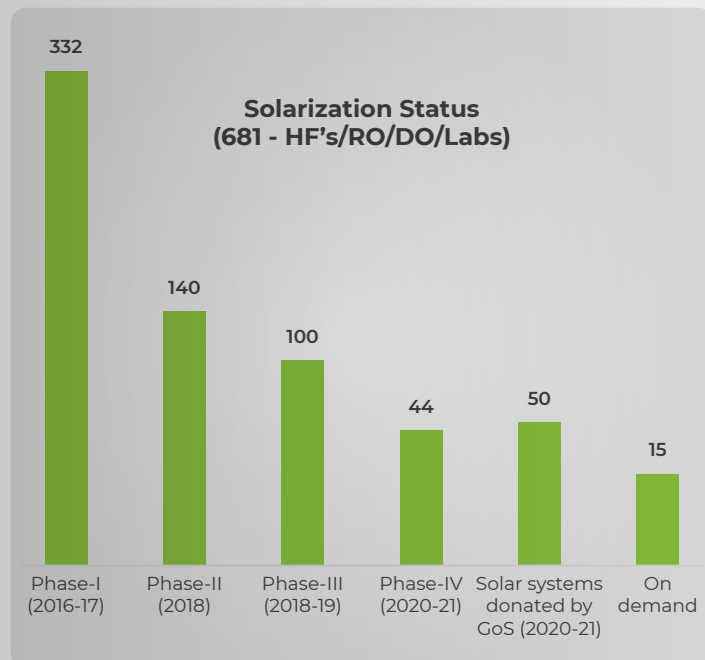
The solarization of the remaining 602 HF's in Phase-V is ongoing. Out of 32 solar systems items, 25 items of value 86 M Rs. have been delivered to all districts, 2 items of value 146 M Rs. are under manufacturing in China, and procurement for the remaining 5 items is in progress, expected to be finalized in 2 months.

After a successful tender process, manufacturing for additional 2700 batteries is underway that will be delivered in 2 months. These batteries will replace the faulty ones across all districts, ensuring improved performance and power backup.

Operation and Maintenance

Through Preventive maintenance PPHI Sindh Successfully maintained 383 solar inverters of Phase-I for another year Under maintenance contracts of 4.7 M Rs. Even after 5 years of usage. Which saved PPHI Sindh from the cost of new purchase i.e. Approx. 68 M Rs.

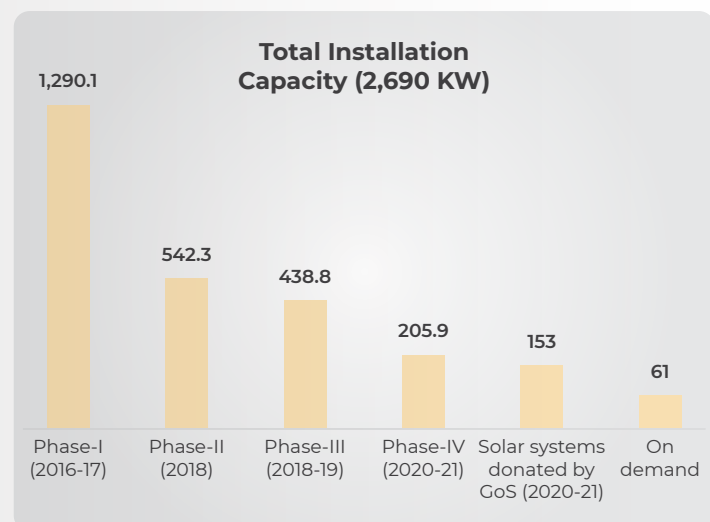
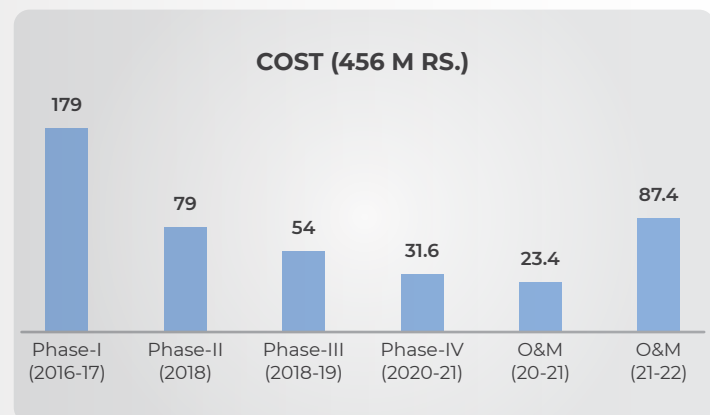

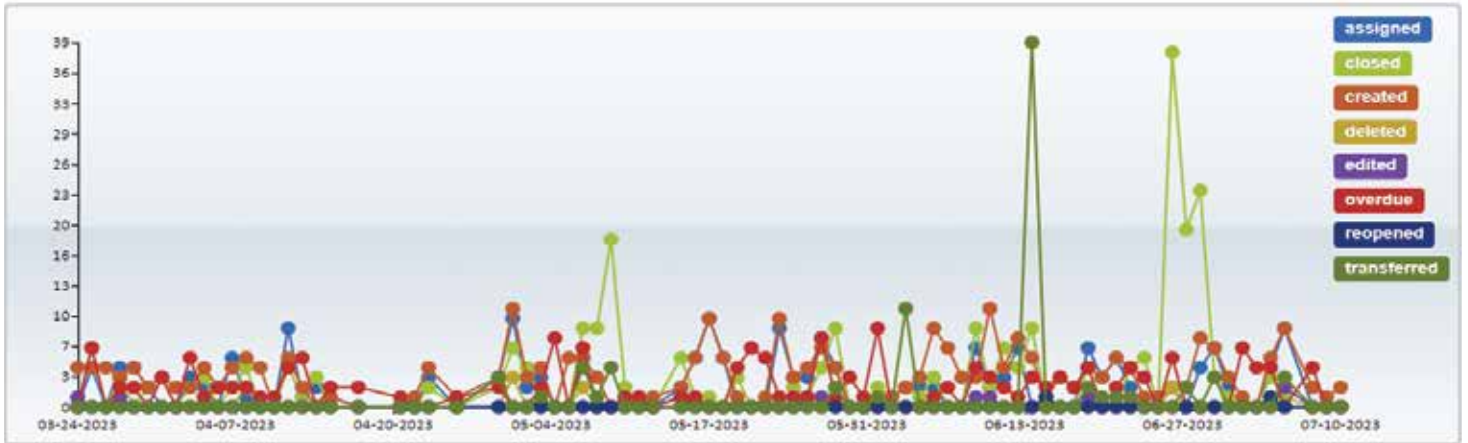
