Quarterly Report Summary: April – June 2026

This summary provides an overview of the key achievements and activities of PPHI Sindh during the second quarter of 2026 (April to June), excluding the initial summary page of the report. The information covers various aspects of healthcare service delivery, infrastructure development, capacity building, and community engagement.

Healthcare Service Delivery at a Glance

During the quarter, PPHI Sindh facilities recorded a Total OPD of 10,226,527, with 6,406,758 new cases and 3,819,769 follow-up cases. Maternal health services remained robust, with 79,910 total deliveries, including 75,216 normal vaginal deliveries (NVDs) and 4,694 C-sections. Family planning initiatives recorded 18,006 Post-Partum Family Planning (PPFP) cases, 25,322 Long-Acting Reversible Contraceptives (LARC) insertions, 6,346 implants, 18,976 Intrauterine Contraceptive Devices (IUCDs), and 39,000 condom distributions. Antenatal care included 232,958 first antenatal care (ANC-1) visits and 714,170 return antenatal care (ANC-RV) visits. Other key indicators included 104,839 cases of Hemoglobin less than 10 (HB<10), 104,465 Oral Contraceptive Pills (OCPs), 140,317 injectables, 313,394 family planning visits, and 314,149 total ultrasounds. Laboratory services performed 3,227,506 total labs, identifying 199,859 TB suspects and 2,269 TB positive cases from 62,854 TB slides.

Quarterly Trends

Comparison of the second quarter with the first quarter of 2026 indicates a modest upward trend in Total OPD, new cases, and follow-up cases. Total deliveries and NVDs recorded a decline

compared to Q1, while ANC-1 visits saw a notable increase — from 201,145 in Q1 to 232,958 in Q2 — reflecting sustained antenatal care uptake. Laboratory services showed significant growth, with total labs rising from 2,860,735 in Q1 to 3,227,506 in Q2. TB suspect identification declined slightly, while TB positive cases increased from 1,722 to 2,269, indicating continued focus on tuberculosis detection and follow-up.

Lab and Pathology Services

The Diagnostic Laboratories recorded a combined total of 136,168 tests across the quarter, with April contributing 46,316 tests, May 40,406 tests, and June 50,139 tests — showing a strong recovery and upward trend by the end of the quarter. DL Larkana recorded the highest quarterly total at 64,456 tests, followed by DL Kousar Hospital at 38,269. June's DL-wise performance showed a combined total of 50,139 tests, with a total monthly business amount of Rs. 14,043,262. A comparison between May and June 2026 indicated increases across all DLs, with an average growth of 20.13% in tests and 19.69% in revenue.

Nutrition

The nutrition programme continued its focus on children under five years, with 1,532,967 children screened across 28 districts. Of these, 64,262 children were admitted for Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM), with 52,559 cured. The programme recorded 1,014 defaults, 21 deaths, 363 non-cured cases, 717 medical transfers, and 2,807 transfers to inpatient facilities (NSC). Key Performance Indicators for the Outpatient Therapeutic Programme (OTP) showed a strong 97% cure rate. Nutrition Stabilization Centre (NSC) performance recorded 2,867 admissions, with 2,639 cured, reflecting a 91% cure rate.

Repair and Renovation

For the fiscal year 2024–25, PPHI Sindh managed 53 carry-forwarded and major repair and renovation schemes. Of these, 29 schemes were completed, 2 were in progress, and 13 were in the tender (NIT) process. The total budget allocation for these schemes was Rs.M 684.100. The quarter saw the successful completion of many health facilities including the renovations at GD Hussain Khan Thora (Hyderabad), GD Habibullah Memon (Hyderabad), BHU Izat Ji Wandh (Larkana-A), and BHU Azizabad, Jacobabad — the last completed under the NHSP Grant.

Training and Capacity Building

During the quarter, a total of 144 trainings were conducted, benefiting 2,637 participants across all regions — a significant increase compared to the 51 trainings and 1,192 participants recorded in Q1. Region-wise, RO-5 conducted the highest number of trainings (37) and also trained the most participants (805), followed by RO-4 with 35 trainings and 627 participants. RO-1 recorded the lowest contribution with 10 trainings and 141 participants.

Monitoring Activities

Monitoring activities during the quarter recorded a grand total of 19,512 visits across all levels. Regional staff collectively conducted 999 visits, including 231 by Regional Directors, 427 by Regional Managers for Monitoring and Evaluation, 181 by Public Health Specialists, and 160 by Regional Managers MNCH. At the district level, District Managers carried out 1,926 visits, Executive Monitoring and Evaluation officers conducted 2,944 visits, Medical Officers performed 1,077 visits, MNCH Coordinators made 1,448 visits, and Social Organizers contributed 1,277 visits — demonstrating continued commitment to oversight, quality assurance, and operational support across all facilities.

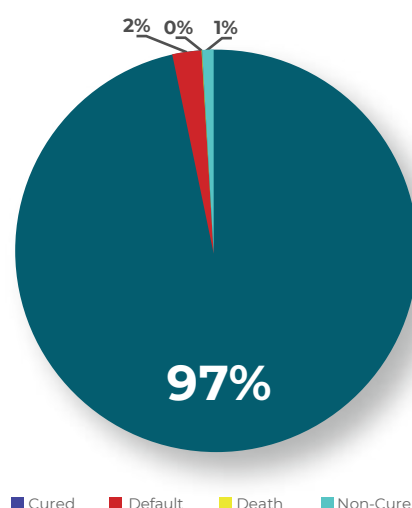

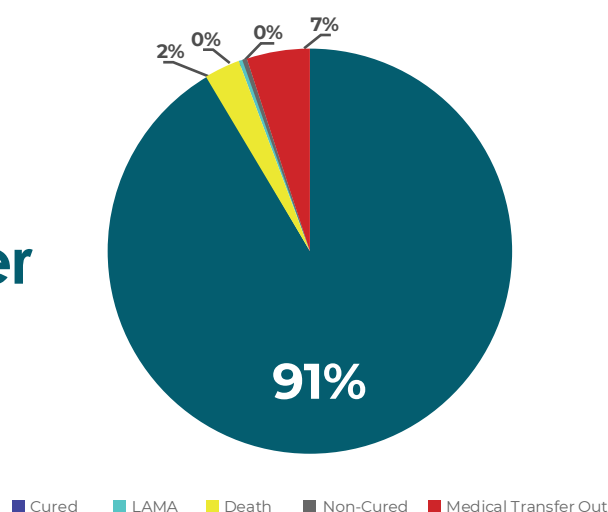
