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## Summary for Quarterly July to September 2024:

The third quarter of 2024 marked significant progress for PPHI Sindh in healthcare service delivery, infrastructure enhancement, and community outreach. Below are the key highlights:

### Infrastructure and Facilities Development

#### • Skills lab:

A new state-of-the-art skills lab was inaugurated at Dumba Goth, Region Karachi enhancing PPHI Sindh's capacity to improve its employees skills and to provide them hands on training.

#### • Medicine Management:

A medicine warehouse at MCHC Kausar Hospital, Khairpur, improved the supply chain and adherence to SOPs.

### Healthcare Service Utilization

#### • Outpatient Visits:

A total of 13.2 million OPD visits were recorded, reflecting high trust in PPHI services.

#### • Maternal Health:

106,763 deliveries, including 101,479 normal deliveries and 5,284 C-sections, were conducted, alongside 204,865 antenatal care visits.

#### • Family Planning:

Distribution of 37,143 postpartum family planning commodities and administration of 46,662 long-acting contraceptives.

### Disease Control & Prevention:

#### • Tuberculosis (TB) Control:

Screening of 258,832 TB suspects, with 2,442 positive cases identified.

#### • Hepatitis Control:

1.4 million people were screened, and over 1.2 million doses of Hepatitis vaccines were administered.

### Nutrition and Child Health:

#### • Malnutrition Management:

79,449 children were treated at OTP sites and NSCs, and 4,200 children were admitted to Nutrition Stabilization Centers.

#### • Nutrition Programs:

Continued focus on addressing acute malnutrition among children under five years.

### Training and Capacity Building

79 training sessions conducted, covering a wide range of topics and benefiting 1,906 participants.

## Community Engagement and Monitoring

Over 26,616 visits and 613 tele-monitoring calls were made to health facilities, ensuring quality service delivery and addressing gaps.

## Events and Strategic Collaborations

- PPHI Sindh signed an MoU with the Sindh Health Department, gaining operational control of health facilities.

- Participation in the National Policy Dialogue on Maternal Nutrition and engagement with World Bank representatives to discuss healthcare support initiatives.

## Activities & Events (Head Office)



The Health Department of the Government of Sindh signed MoU with PPHI Sindh and transferred operational control of its health facilities to PPHI Sindh. This collaboration marks a significant milestone in the ongoing efforts of GoS and PPHI Sindh to reform and strengthen the healthcare system of Sindh.



PPHI Sindh celebrated the inauguration of the newly repaired and renovated BHU Mataro Mandhro by CEO PPHI Sindh, Mr. Javed Ali Jagirani in DO Badin-B. The ceremony was attended by Mr. Mazhar Ali Veesar, RD RO-II, Ms. Razia Sultana, DM Badin-B, along with local stakeholders.



PPHI Sindh's CEO, Mr. Javed Ali Jagirani, inaugurated the newly repaired and renovated buildings of District Office (DO) Khairpur - A and BHU Layari. During the visit, Mr. Javed Ali Jagirani, accompanied by Regional Director – Sukkur, Col (R) Sirajuddin, Director Health Services, Dr. Zakir Ali, and District Manager Khairpur A, Mr. Irfan Hyder, interacted with the community and received positive feedback on the services provided by PPHI. He also visited the DO warehouse, recommending further improvements. The surprise visits were also made to RHC Halani and BHU Plus Kunda Khahi DO NSF. He also visited RHC Dadloi, Sukkur, during the night shift. Furthermore, Mr. Javed Ali Jagirani chaired the Monthly Review Meeting (MRM) of RO-III and RO-IV at the conference hall of RO-IV Sukkur.

In July 2024, PPHI Sindh's CEO, Mr. Javed Ali Jagirani, led the Quarterly Review Meeting (QRM) at the MCH Jannat Gul conference hall in RO-VI Karachi. The session, attended by key team members including Director Health Services Dr. Zakir Ali and Senior Director Mr. Israr Ahmed Sodhar, focused on reviewing critical performance indicators.



In July 2024, The World Bank representatives led by Mr. Manav Bhattarai Health Specialist, World Bank South Asia Region called on CEO PPHI Sindh at Karachi to discuss the technical and operational support needed to accelerate the program's implementation.



PPHI Sindh's team, led by CEO Mr. Javed Ali Jagirani, actively participated in the National Policy Dialogue on the Economic Case for Maternal Nutrition, organized by Nutrition International at Bhurban. During the event, Mr. Javed Ali Jagirani highlighted PPHI Sindh's ongoing nutritional initiatives aimed at reducing maternal malnutrition, particularly in underserved communities. The dialogue provided a valuable platform for sharing insights and strategies to address maternal nutrition challenges, reinforcing PPHI Sindh's role as a leader in public health innovation.

## Activities & Events (Head Office)



In August 2024, the CEO of PPHI Sindh, Mr. Javed Ali Jagirani, inaugurated the newly repaired and renovated building of DCD Manzoorabad, Jamshoro - A. The event was well-attended by the staff of the organisation.



A review meeting for the Expanded Program on Immunization (EPI) was chaired by the CEO PPHI Sindh, Mr. Javed Ali Jagirani at the conference hall in Dadu. The meeting was attended by key officials of PPHI Sindh to discuss previous meeting minutes, distribution of motorbikes and mobile phones, microplanning, vaccinator rationalization, defaulter and refuser coverage, outbreak analysis, cold chain management, and antigen-wise coverage.



The 5-day Orientation for District Managers and Head Office Officers at PPHI Sindh was a comprehensive and enriching experience that took place in August 2024. Led by Mr. Javed Ali Jagirani, the CEO, participants were introduced to the organization's overview, emphasizing PPHI Sindh's commitment to honesty. Each day unfolded with recitations, insightful sessions, and engaging presentations by various wings, including Administration, Repair & Renovation, Nutrition, Procurement, Monitoring, Human Resource, Solarization, Research, IT, and Technical teams. The participants were given certificates on the final day.

## Activities & Events (Head Office)



Mr. Javed Ali Jagirani, CEO of PPHI Sindh, visited a medical camp in the hard-to-reach area of FP Chinni Band, Taluka Johi. During the visit, the CEO engaged with community members, gaining insights into their healthcare needs and addressing their concerns directly.

PPHI Sindh's CEO led the September progress meeting with department heads to review ongoing projects and strategize future plans. Held at the PPHI Sindh Head Office, the meeting focused on improving healthcare services, optimizing resources, and enhancing partnerships.

## Activities & Events (Head Office)



PPHI Sindh successfully conducted a 4-day e-Office training in collaboration with the National Information Technology Board (NITB) in September 2024 at PPHI Sindh Head Office in Karachi. The training, led by Ms. Quratulain, enhanced digital proficiency for staff from six different wings of the organisation, equipping them with the skills to streamline administrative operations. This initiative is a significant step toward PPHI Sindh's goal of going paperless, contributing to improved efficiency and reducing environmental impact.



In September, the Provincial Review Meeting took place at the Regional Office, Hyderabad, chaired by the Chief Executive Officer of PPHI Sindh. This important gathering aimed to assess the performance of districts and regions to improve healthcare services across the province.



The monthly appraisal meeting for May and June was held at the PPHI Sindh Head Office, under the guidance of CEO Mr. Javed Ali Jagirani to assess both individual and team performances, fostering an environment for constructive feedback exchange and goal setting for the upcoming months.

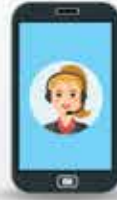
