Overview

During the third quarter of 2025, PPHI Sindh sustained its strong role in providing primary healthcare, improving maternal and child health services, expanding infrastructure, and enhancing disease prevention and nutrition programs across Sindh.

Service Delivery and Maternal Health

OPD Visits: 11.85 million (including 7.53 million new and 4.32 million follow-up cases).

Deliveries: 121,775 total; 114,769 Normal Vaginal Deliveries (NVDs) and 7,006 C-sections.

Antenatal Care (ANC): 214,352 new registrations; 735,279 repeat visits.

Family Planning: 329,385 clients served.

43,986 LARCs, 35,020 IUCDs, 128,812 injectables, 109,071 oral pills, 43,523 condoms, 8,966 implants.

Public Health Programs

Tuberculosis (TB): 235,455 suspected cases screened; 2,435 confirmed positive.

Nutrition Program

Screening: 1.72 million children under 5 screened for malnutrition.

OTP Program: 70,221 children admitted, with 96% cured rate.

Nutrition Stabilization Centers (NSC): 2,707 children treated for severe acute malnutrition with medical complications.

Laboratory & Diagnostic Services

Total Lab Tests: 3.88 million tests

- Highest output from Mirpurkhas (31,305 tests).
- Ultrasounds: 327.629 conducted across districts.
- Blood Services: 3,730 blood donor matches and 106 transfusions for Thalassemia patients.

Repair & Renovation

- Projects: 45 schemes launched (30 in progress, 13 under tender, 2 completed).
- Budget Allocation: Rs. 644.1 million (Rs. 62.5 million released).

Training, Monitoring & Capacity Building

- Trainings Conducted: 77 sessions with 2,073 participants across 6 regions.
- Monitoring Visits: 30,943 visits at regional and district levels.

Key Focus: Quality assurance, timely reporting, and performance accountability.

Partnerships & Strategic Engagement

Collaborations: Continued engagement with World Bank, UNICEF, and AKU.

AI-Enabled Ultrasound **Initiative:** In partnership with CERP and supported by the

Gates Foundation to deploy 20 devices in underserved districts.

Health Camps & Screenings: Including mammography and outreach programs.

Policy Dialogues: On maternal nutrition, UHC, and polio eradication.

CEO-Led Reviews: Conducted at headquarters and regional levels to improve operational efficiency.

Health Carnival 2025: Active participation with JSMU and JPMC at Maritime Museum, Karachi.







NEWS AND EVENTS



The Department of Health, Government of Sindh, has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with PPHI Sindh and the Centre for Economic Research in Pakistan (CERP) to pilot Al-enabled handheld ultrasound devices at primary health-care facilities in underserved districts. Supported by the Gates Foundation, the initiative will deploy 20 devices across six districts, expanding access to life-saving diagnostic imaging for pregnant women in areas without conventional ultrasound services.



The Operation Theatre services were started at RHC Jhudo, with two successful C-sections performed on the very first day.



A high-level session on "Primary Health Care & Universal Health Coverage – Where We Stand", organized by Badar Expo Solutions, in collaboration with Dow University of Health Sciences and PNS Shifa Hospital, brought together leading health experts to discuss progress toward global health goals. Ill Moderated by Dr. Zainab Hasan of the Sindh Healthcare Commission, the panel featured renowned professionals including Prof. Jawed Akram, Dr. Asif Imam, Dr. Somia Iqtadar, Mr. Jawed Ali Jagirani, and Dr. Khalid Shafi. The discussion focused on strengthening primary healthcare and expanding access to quality services in Pakistan.



PPHI Sindh conducted its monthly review meeting at the Head Office under the chairmanship of CEO, Mr. Javed Ali Jagirani. The meeting brought together senior management and key departmental leads to review progress, assess performance indicators, and discuss strategies to further strengthen health-care service delivery across Sindh.

The event, organized by Jinnah Sindh Medical University (JSMU) in collaboration with Jinnah Postgraduate Medical Centre (JPMC), brought together leading healthcare institutions to highlight preventive health, awareness, and community well-being initiatives

The Joint Performance Review Meeting (PRM) for the months of April and May 2025 of Regional Offices I and VI was held at Marvi Garden Complex, Hyderabad, under the chairmanship of Mr. Javed Ali Jagirani, CEO PPHI Sindh. The meeting saw active participation from DHS I & II, Regional Directors along with their core teams, District Managers, and District Technical Teams (DTTs).

PPHI Sindh conducted a one-hour training session on Basic Life Support (BLS), with a particular focus on Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR), at the Head Office level. The session included both theoretical discussions on the causes of cardiac arrest and practical, hands-on training in CPR techniques. All directors and Head of Wings actively participated, engaging in demonstrations and practicing the necessary skills for performing CPR effectively.



The CEO PPHI Sindh, accompanied by the COO, DHS I & II and Director HR, visited the Training of Trainers (TOT) session for Medical Officers on Clinical Guidelines for Universal Health Coverage (UHC), organized by Aga Khan University (AKU) at Indus Hotel, Hyderabad. The initiative aims to prepare master trainers who will cascade knowledge and ensure the implementation of standardized clinical protocols under UHC at District Tando Allahyar, in collaboration with AKU and PPHI Sindh.
