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In the second quarter of 2025, PPHI Sindh focused on strengthening healthcare delivery, expanding infrastructure, and advancing public health initiatives across the province, leading to meaningful progress.

were carried out across the regional and district levels to ensure service quality and compliance.

The following are the key highlights:

1. Service Delivery and Maternal Health

PPHI Sindh recorded 10.1 million outpatient visits. A total of 70,871 safe deliveries were conducted, including 3,399 caesarean sections. Additionally, 217,763 women received antenatal care (ANC-1), and 319,289 visits of family planning were catered to.

2. Public Health Programs

The Tuberculosis program screened 212,351 suspected cases and managed 2,860 confirmed cases. The Hepatitis initiative screened over 686,164 individuals and administered more than 425,211 vaccine doses.

3. Nutrition Initiative

The Nutrition Program treated 53,995 children in OTP centers and admitted 3,296 children to Nutrition Stabilization Centers (NSCs). Over 1.5 million children under five were screened for malnutrition.

4. Infrastructure Development and Logistics

Out of 59 new renovation schemes, 5 are in progress and 54 have been completed.

5. Training and Monitoring

PPHI Sindh conducted 66 training sessions, reaching 1,252 staff members. Over 28,249 monitoring visits

5. Partnerships and Strategic Engagement

PPHI Sindh signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Willows International to expand service areas and enhance reproductive health programs, and with the Pakistan Institute of Living and Learning (PILL) to launch 'Improving Access to Psychological Therapies Pakistan (IAPT-PK)' program. Discussions were also held with key partners like the World Bank, Aga Khan University, and UNICEF.

6. Key Events and Initiatives

CEO PPHI Sindh, participated in the Multi-regional Workshop and Field Visit on the Multisectoral Nutrition Program in Indonesia, held from June 17-20, 2025, in Jakarta and Sumedang. PPHI Sindh participated in the National Symposium on Primary Healthcare held at Aga Khan University from 14-16 April 2025.

7. Laboratory and Diagnostic Services

A total of 89,046 lab tests were conducted during the quarter across PPHI Sindh facilities. The key region to contribute to the quarterly lab output was Mirpurkhas (34,093 tests).

8. Performance of RHCs

Rural Health Centers (RHCs) showed strong performance, with OPD visits rising by 16%, family planning clients increasing by 16%, and ANC-1 registrations growing by 12%. Diagnostic services saw significant gains, with ultrasounds increasing by 5% and X-rays by 38%.
