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Maternal, Neonatal, and Child Health (MNCH) is a crucial area of focus for Government of Sindh for years. In cooperation with Health and Population Welfare Department, GoS, PPHI Sindh is committed to improve MNCH outcomes, including Family Planning, Nutrition, Immunization, Maternal and Child Health, and Communicable and Non-Communicable Diseases.

PPHI Sindh's efforts have yielded significant results, as reflected in the following statistics for the Quarter-January to March 2023:

■ OPD

During this quarter, a total of 9,895,198 patients received OPD services. Out of these patients, 6,562,453 were new cases while 3,332,745 were follow-up cases.

■ Family Planning

PPHI Sindh provided family planning services to over 254,419 patients, including 30,499 postpartum family planning services. Other family planning services provided include 68,171 OCPs, 32,799 condoms, 111,071 injectables, 14,245 implants, 24,098 IUCDs, (38,343 LARCs).

■ Maternal and Child Health

PPHI Sindh also provided ANC services to over 171,200 women, leading to an increase in the number of institutional deliveries, 78,721 including 75,662 NVDs and 3,049 cesarean sections.

■ Capacity Building

Additionally, the organization trained over 844 health workers on essential maternal and child health practices, leading to improved health outcomes among mothers and children.

■ Nutrition

PPHI Sindh reached over 167,000 children under the age of 5 with its nutrition interventions, including the provision of therapeutic food and nutritional counseling.

■ Immunization

PPHI Sindh delivered routine immunization services to children under 5. As a result, the coverage of essential vaccines, such as the pentavalent vaccine and measles vaccine, has increased to over 90%.

■ Communicable and Non-Communicable Diseases

PPHI Sindh conducted awareness-raising campaigns on communicable and non-communicable diseases, reaching over 360,350 individuals. Additionally, the organization has provided treatment and management services to over 37,992 individuals with chronic diseases such as diabetes and hypertension.

■ Diagnostics

Furthermore, PPHI Sindh gave consultation to 178,540 TB suspect cases and tested 38,906 TB slides, resulting in 2,087 TB positive cases. PPHI Sindh also conducted 210,630 ultrasounds and 3,404,349 laboratory tests during this period.

In conclusion, PPHI Sindh is making significant improvements in MNCH outcomes in Sindh. The organization's comprehensive approach has contributed to the positive statistics presented above. Its efforts are crucial in improving the health and well-being of mothers, newborns, and children, and the organization remains committed to this cause.

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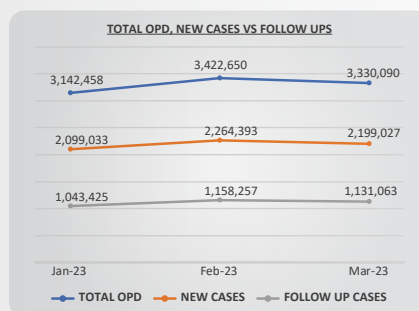

Nutrition Program

Malnutrition is a serious public health issue that occurs when people do not receive adequate nutrients from their diet, leading to various health problems.

Sindh has been facing significant challenges with malnutrition, in Sindh, several factors contribute to the prevalence of malnutrition:

Poverty: A large proportion of the population in Sindh lives below the poverty line, which limits their access to nutritious food and healthcare.

Food Insecurity: Food insecurity, caused by factors such as inadequate agricultural production, distribution challenges, and economic instability, can exacerbate malnutrition rates.

Limited Access to Healthcare: Inadequate access to healthcare facilities and services can result in poor maternal and child health, contributing to malnutrition in infants and young children.

Water and Sanitation Issues: Poor access to clean drinking water and sanitation facilities can lead to waterborne diseases and worsen the malnutrition situation.

Educational Awareness: Lack of awareness and education about proper nutrition and health practices may contribute to the persistence of malnutrition in some communities.

Displacement and Natural Disasters: Sindh has also faced challenges related to population displacement due to conflicts or natural disasters, which can further aggravate the nutritional status of affected communities.

In Sindh, the global acute malnutrition (GAM) rate was 23.3% (NNS 2018), which is much higher than the 15% WHO emergency threshold. At least 40.2% of children under the age of 5 were chronically undernourished (stunted), and around 96% of children U2 years did not consume a minimum tolerable diet. The present floods has further worsened the food insecurity and has further deteriorated the malnutrition status.

During the reporting period, PPHI Sindh is implementing various nutrition related projects in 23 districts of Sindh, which in collaboration of the Accelerated Action Plan (AAP), Health Department, GoS, World Food Programme (WFP), Concern World Wide (CWW), UNICEF, RSPN and Save the Children (STC). The major activities are Nutritional Screening, management of Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM) with & without medical complications, management of U5 children suffering from Moderate Acute Malnutrition (MAM), nutritional care of the malnourished Pregnant & Lactating Women, provision of multiple micro nutrient to children & PLW including Iron Folic Acid (IFA) and of course most important the counselling and interactive health and nutrition sensitive educational sessions.

Nutrition: PPHI Sindh reached over 167,000 children & their mothers for the nutrition interventions, including the provision of therapeutic food and nutritional counseling.

Program for Improved Nutrition Sindh (Dadu and Jamshoro)

Project Brief:

PPHI Sindh has been implementing nutrition-specific (ER-2) component of PINS Programme in 8 districts of Sindh since 2019 whereas same Programme was initiated in District Dadu and Jamshoro by RSPN lately due to unforeseen circumstances. Since Rural Support Network (RSPN) implemented the European Union-funded Programme "Implementation of the nutrition-specific component of the Programme for Improved Nutrition in Sindh" (PINS) ER-2 in district Dadu and Jamshoro. PPHI Sindh came into agreement with Rural Support Network (RSPN) from dated 15 October 2020, for the services of the

Outpatient Therapeutic Programme (OTP) and Nutrition Stabilization Centre (NSC). Thus, OTP establishment was carried out soon after agreement but OTP Services has been started in the month February 2021.

Main activities carried out at OTP & NSCs are as under:

OTP:

- Assessment for Acute Malnutrition of Children, 6 to 59 months of age.
- Treatment of Acute Malnutrition through specialized nutritious food
- Regular follow ups and brief examination of enrolled malnourished children for progress monitoring.
- Identification and referral of complicated malnourished children to Nutrition Stabilization Center for further management of their critical phase of complications
- Health facility-based health awareness sessions with particular attention to malnutrition, its consequences and preventive measures and IYCF.

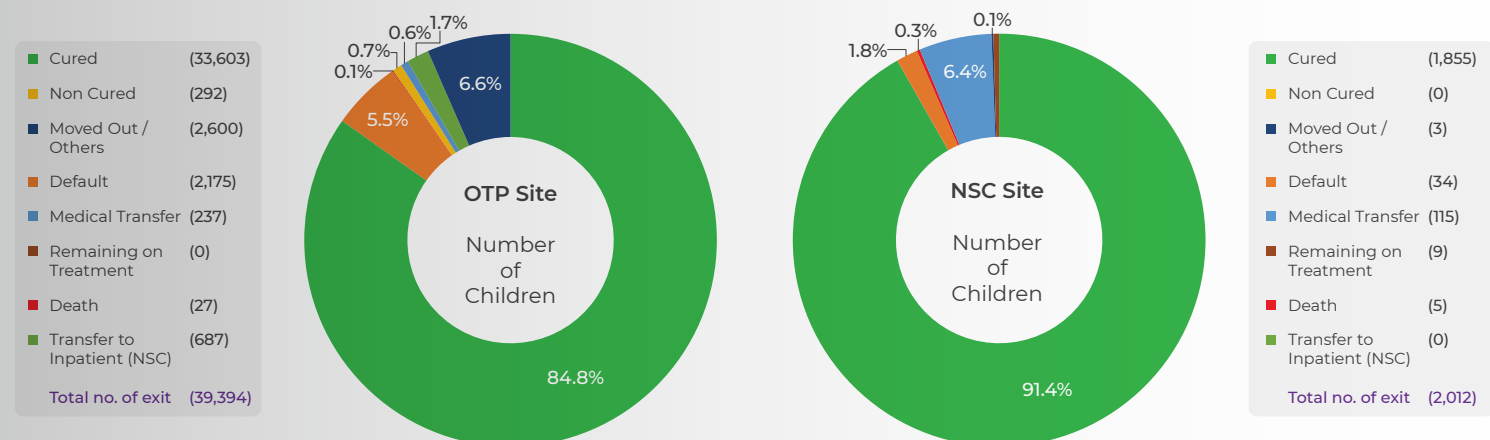
NSC:

- Treatment of Severe Acute Malnutrition with other medical complications.
- Coordination with OTP for proper follow up of discharge and new cases.
- Regular follow ups & detailed examination of admitted malnourished children for progress checkup and timely refer to higher level hospital if required.

OTP Site Structure

PPHI Sindh is implementing the Outpatient Therapeutic Programme (OTP) in PPHI-managed health facilities of both targeted districts. Under the proposed action, a total of 93 OTPs (52 in Dadu and 41 in Jamshoro) will be established in health facilities being managed by PPHI.

Nutrition Stabilization Centre:

PPHI Sindh has been establishing and managing Nutrition Stabilization Centers in Dadu and Jamshoro districts. In district Jamshoro, NSC has already been established by the Department of Health GOS at the Liaquat University of Medical and Health Sciences (LUMHS) Jamshoro, however this NSC is facing severe shortage of staff and supplies. PPHI will collaborate with LUMHS for strengthening of NSC. In district Dadu, PPHI and District Health Officer Dadu have proposed to establish NSC for Dadu at a newly constructed Syed Abdullah Shah Institute of Medical Sciences (SASIMS) at Sehwan that is Tehsil of District Jamshoro.

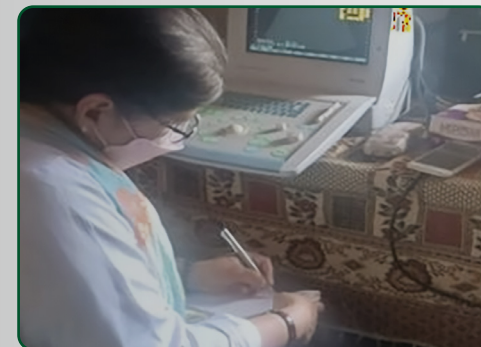
