TM is done via phone and specified check list is filled (online) for assessing the availability of Staff, services, supplies and capacity of HCP working in evening and Night Shift.

### Revision of Maternal Death Audit Structure

- Maternal Death is one of the most important indicator and it is the top priority of PPHI to evaluate the cause each death in PPHI HFs and take the preventive measures to reduce loss of precious lives at minimal level.
- Previously WHO general format was used audit the deaths but it missed some of local context indicators. According to WHO recommendation format has been revised
- Maternal Death Audit Committee also has been notified to study the every death cases and give its recommendation for prevention in future.

## Revised Referral Guidelines for MCH

- Labor and Delivery is a physiological process where complications can occur at any time any stage. Early identification of complication is necessary for timely referral in order to save the lives.
- Referral protocols and guidelines have been drafted and instructions in local language have also been designed on pamphlets for pasting in each Labor Room.
- Charts for identification of High Risk Pregnancies are also being designed.



## Major Achievements

- A DAC meeting successfully conducted where most of the paras were settled subject to verification.
- PPHI Sindh responded promptly to recent rain and flood emergency and organised around 7,500 free medical camps which provided free OPD services to 1,336,426 patients.
- The organisation also took over the management control of 28 new RHCs.
- The training and capacity building wing trained 2,519 participants on topics including DHIS, SAS, Labour Care Guide-WHO, MISP, IDSR, Ultrasound, IMNCI, KMC, IPC, PCPNC and MCPC.
- First state of the art blood bank fully equipped with latest technology has been established at District Lab Mirpurkhas.
